Preamble

Academic Audit of Departments is an essential component of quality enhancement in Higher Education Institutions. In fact, the IQAC meeting held on 2 February, 2020 had mooted this very novel initiative to be taken up immediately. Consequently, the IQAC of the College constituted a team of experienced faculty as to conduct the Audit. Under pandemic situation the audit could not include external members and has been limited to online study and analysis. The audit team was divided as per domain expertise into two groups, namely, Language and Social Science. A common format for collecting baseline information was prepared by IQAC and provided to the teams studying the Departments (**ReferAnnexure-1**).

Schedule :-

As per the decision made in the IQAC meeting, the academic audit was to be held on 25 March, 2020 but underpandemic situation the process has been solely conducted online and individual visithas not been possible.it was done finally on 25 June, 2020.

- To examine and suggest improvement to the vision and mission of the Departments.
- To collect primary baseline data regarding academic eco-system of the respectiveDepartment.
- 3. To interact with the faculty regarding strengths, weaknesses, challenges and achievements of theDepartment.
- 4. To assess the research potential and suggest areas that could be taken upfor research by faculty during the next 12 months ormore.
- To suggest ways and means of introducing innovations in the teaching- learning process as well as capacity building among stakeholders.

Methodology :

After close examination of the information sheets furnished by the departments, priorities of the audit were determined. Detailed discussions with the faculty of the department about all aspects of academics and other allied activities were made.

All the records pertaining to both curricular and extra-curricular activities were examined to find out the sufficiency and deficiency in academic management and accordingly suggestions were made to upgrade the delivery mechanism of the departments. Seminar Bulletins, Annual Reports and Activities Albums were accessed and duly analyzed to evaluate the quality of teaching- learning.

Vision, Mission and Action Plan of the departments were assessed as a very important facet of the audit system to work upon them for formulating a larger Action Plan for future.

Significant Findings :

The findings of the academic audit (Department-wise) are as follows :-

SOCIAL SCIENCE DEPARTMENTS

- (1) History :- The History department has 1 regular members of the teaching faculty, to of whom have been awarded M.Phil. degree. There are 4 GAPTT They are engaged in both teaching and extension activities. Students' performance is satisfactory and their feedback is equally good. Teacher participation in seminar activities issatisfactoryandinthecurrentyearhas been studied. Greater focus has to be made by the teachers for research activities like publication The faculty members are to be motivated for research and faculty development
- (2) Political Science: The department has 1 permanent teacher and 1 Guest teacher. The permanent staff is pursuing PhD and has completed M.Phil. The department has 1 vacant post. The department is comparatively weaker and has been advised to motivate students and also to involve in research and faculty development. Initiate student seminars and workshops. The audit team also recommends departmental library and updation of library books

LANGUAGE DEPARTMENTS

- (3) English : The dept. has 2 full time faculty members and 3 GAPTT. 1 full time faculty member is also a M.Phil degree holder as well as currently the IQAC coordinator. Also she was the coordinator during NAAC visit of cycle 1. The other full time teacher is a GB member and also pursuing PHD. The team suggested modifications in the method of teaching learning to make it more dynamic and also to update and form dept, library. The team also makes suggestions for improving the publications of the Department as they were found to be lopsided
- (4) Sanskrit : The department has 2 full time Asst. Prof. One of them being

the IQAC chairperson as well as the teacher in charge. It has 2 GAPTT and 1 guest teacher as well. The team suggested a positive formulation of the Vision and Mission statement, keeping in view the importance of Sanskrit in exposing youth to the rich resources of Ancient India. The Department should also work towards making Sanskrit a living language in the present time. The team Suggested the inclusion of all details about publications and seminar participation in the format.

- (5) Bengali: The dept. has 2 full time faculty and 1 GAPTT and 1 guest teacher. One of the full time members is also a PhD holder. The team suggested a modification of Vision and Mission statement to reflect the importance of Bengali as an effective vehicle for propagation of Bengali Literature and Comparative Studies. Also suggest the promotion of seminar and workshops and faculty development participations.
- (6) Santali: The dept has 3 guest teachers. The team recommends the dept. to apply for full time faculty and to improve their vision and mission and also to promote tribal studies. The team Suggested the inclusion of all details about publications and seminar participation in the format.

1. Involvement of students

This time, we had no scope to interact with students while conducting academic audit.

Suggestion:

From next academic Audit, **student representatives having good academic career should also be involved in the matter of Academic audit**. They too can contribute good suggestions for academicimprovement.

1. Pattern of Examination:

The existing pattern of examination is of traditional type.

Suggestion :

- 1. Examination reforms must be urgently undertaken towards improvement of understanding and innovation. This will facilitate the students to join National and International Institutes of repute and face NETexaminations.
- 2 College authorities may motivate the students for reading original texts and reference books for facing the abovementioned examinations.

2. Other Suggestions:

 The Departments should take the initiative in motivating students to workshops and research innovations as well as to progress towards digitalization of teaching-learning process.

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS :-

The following suggestions by the Academic Audit team may be given due consideration by the authorities for promoting academic

- 1. Greater response by the teachers in pursuit of research activities and **publication in different journals** of national and international repute.
- (1) Encouragement of seminar activities among students for in-depth study on subject-specific course along with teacher-participation and guidance; Provision for extra-mural lectures during seminar; more impetus may be given to organize National State-Level-Seminars.
- (2) Arrangement of **remedial classes**, doubt-clearing classes for students may be undertaken at least once aweek.
- (3) Opening up of a "Career Counselling Cell" in each department under the guidance of a teacher to facilitate student awareness on career prospects in addition to general counselling for thestudents.
- (4) Strengthening of **proctorial activities** to strengthen student-teacher interaction.
- (5) Arrangement of **parent-teacher meeting** regularly after each midsemester and semester-end exam. Student feedback to parents and parent-teacher interaction for students' welfare must receive prime attention.
- (6) Preparation of a Student Database for pass-out students, maintenance of an alumni Directory, strengthening of Alumni Association for greater involvement of the old students in promoting academic and infrastructural development of theCollege.
- (7) Regular **departmental teachers meeting** at least once in a month to review the academic and extra-curricular performance of thestudent.

- (8) Organizing of workshops for teachers to update their studentspecific- knowledge with the help of financial assistance of the Govt., Inter-Govt. Agencies, UGC, ICPR, ICSSR, Alumni and CorporateHouses.
- (9) Facilities of Field Visit, Study Tour on relevant subjects to improve the academic excellence of students andteachers.
- (10) Liberal funding of the department seminar by the Govt. or other agencies for the purchase of original texts, reference books andjournals.

Creation of a **seminar fund** for every department with stipulation to procure original books, reference materials and journals.

- (11) Promotion of **ICT based teaching-learning** by teachers, students to facilitate access to recent literature on the subject online. Steps may be taken for the purchase of different ICT equipments and gadgets along with training programme for operating them. The existing Wi-Fi arrangement shall enable the aboverequirement.
- (12) More effective functioning of **Women Counselling Centre** should be established for greater access and understanding of the problems of girl students in tune, with the government policy of accelerating women's education at higherlevel.
- (13) Encouraging students' feedback of the department or institution on regularbasis.
- (14) Greater facilities for sports and games (outdoor/indoor), gymnasium facilities and Yoga-Instructions periodically round the year; Govt. & UGC may be moved in thisdirection.
- (15) Introduction of Courses on Human Rights, Environmental Ethics and Yoga may be imparted to students at least once a week to facilitate holistic development of thestudents.
- (16) Complete digitization of the Library and access online to books, study materials in the library; for introduction of online courses on skill development involvement of different stakeholders/Alumni/Parents/Corporate House etc may be encouraged under Govt approval.

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATIONS

Basing upon the findings of the Academic Audit, the following recommendations are suggested by the IQAC :

- 1. For the purpose of quality enhancement the library should be updated with sufficient number of CBCS-basedbooks.
- 2 Taking into consideration the proposal of initiating students' hostel. steps may be taken to introduce P.G. Courses in subjects like English, PoliticalScience,Bengali Sanskrit, History.
- 3. Effective steps must be taken for creation of new posts in different subjects taking into consideration the CBCS workload.
- 4. Teacher-Pupil Ratio should be maintained properly by filling up of vacant posts.
- 5. Capacity-building programme should be organized for orienting faculty members on CBCSsyllabus.
