BRIEF HISTORY

Sankrail Anil Biswas Smriti Mahavidyalaya established in 2007 and affiliated to Vidyasagar University is the outcome of genuine and sincere effort of the people of all spheres of sankrail and neighbouring Blocks. The College has been named in the memory of a person who has devoted his life for the cause of the poor and the downtrodden. We feel great pride in this achievement.

In the last few years there has been a tremendous development in this area like any other part of west Bengal . many demands of the people of this area have been fulfilled . In spite of this the people feel a long left want ,an Institution for higher education for their younger generation .the area is inhabited by many poor S.C,S.T. and the minority community who cannot afford even the minimum expenses for the higher education of their wards.keeping them in hostels or boardings away from their home.

As there was no institution for higher education in this Block (Sankrail,Paschim Medinipur)and the neighbouring Blocks, such as Keshiary,Narayangrah, Gopiballavpur-II ,some local social workers and enthusiasts for education formed an NGO Sankrail Block Education and Rural Development Society',a philanthropic Society which has been registered in the year 2003, the Governing Body of the society formed an Organizing Committee for the proposed college by the time ,which did the usual preliminaries to start an Undergraduate General Degree College. After fulfilling all the conditions, our College has got the necessary approval from the Higher Education Dept. Govt of West Bengal and affiliation from the Vidyasagar University, Midnapur to start the college from the

academic session 2007-2008. The authority of the local Kultikri S.C. High School (H.S) had given permission to use a Block if its Buildings and the infrastructural facilities to run the college till the buildings and the infrastructural facilities of the college are completed. The college authority is grateful to the school authority for this benevolent help. At present the college has been shifted to its own three storied building .

The Sankrail Block is situated within Jhargram Sub-Divisional of Paschim Medinipur , which has a unique natural beauty and ecological condition conducive to health and learning ,surrounded by forested having red Laterite soil. The location of the college lies at convenient place having a network of bus and other forms of transport which would help the potential students not only belonging of Sankrail Block but also to the three neighbouring Blocks and continue their study at a minimum expense.the Institution will ,provide an opportunity for general higher education to the first generation learners of the poor families of this locality.We think the Institution will provide quality education ,develop personality and ideal disciplined citizenship in students,enhance creative skill and inculcate ethical and moral values among the students.We do hope ,the college authority ,the teachers and the non-teaching staff,the students and the guardians and the local people endeavour their best of create an atmosphere in this Institution to make it a great seat of learning and excellence .the sapling which is being planted now, will grow into a large tree with full blossom and fruits by the sustainable effort of the people of all spheres.

- Mutilation of Library books is a punishable offence.
- **Ragging In Any Form Is Strictly Prohibited.** Disciplinary action will be taken against those who violate this rule. Ragging in any form is a punishable offence. It is strictly prohibited in the College premises. The College will strictly follow the UGC regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Education Institutions

[under Section 26(1) (g) of UGC Act,1956; Order No.F.1-16/2007 (CPP II), dated 17th June, 2009]. These will be followed to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging including any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act, which has the effect of teasing , treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students, which causes or is likely to cause annoyance , hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student, or asking any student to do any act, which such student will not in ordinary course do and, which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

ATTENDANCE

In accordance with the Rules of the Vidyasagar University the College strictly adheres to following norms of attendance to classes (theoretical/ practical / tutorial) :

- A student attending **at least 75%** of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- A student attending **at least 60% but less than 75%** of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations
- A student attending **less than 60%** of the total number of classes* held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he /she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.

**Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, whichever is later.*

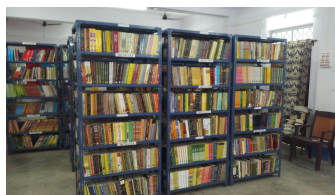

RULES OF THE LIBRARY

- On showing of the Identity Card each student will be provided with a borrower's card against which books will be issued.
- Library Cards are non-transferable. Loss of this card must be reported immediately to the Librarian and a fresh card will be issued on payment of fine.
- Students may borrow one book at a time. Books must be returned within 7 days from the date of issue, failing which a fine will be charged on a per day basis. Till the payment of the fine, the borrowing facility will be withdrawn.
- Students must ensure that the borrowed book is in proper condition. Any book lost, damaged or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. Until the damage is made good, the borrower will have no right to use the library. Students must renew their library cards after taking fresh admission in the Second year, Third year or Semester.
- Students must return their library books before appearing for the final Semester examinations or else their examination results will be withheld.
- Students seeking transfer and students appearing in Part III (Old) & Final Semester Examination must obtain a clearance certificate from the library-in charge before a transfer certificate or admit card is issued.

ADMISSION

The admission process is strictly online and in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Vidyasagar University and the West Bengal Higher Education Department. A student at the time of the admission must show original copies and submit the attested copies of the following documents *:

- Madhyamik Admit Card
- H.S. Mark Sheet
- Four passport size photographs
- A certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended
- Attested copy of S.C/S.T/Physically Handicaped certificate (if applicable)
- Migration certificate in case of students coming from the other Board/University.

* Document verification depends on the order of the West Bengal Higher Education Department.

Admission will be made on the basis of merit points secured by the students where the merit points will be calculated as per the following admission rules of the Vidyasagar University-

a) Students who have passed Higher Secondary or Equivalent examination with minimum 45% marks in the aggregate (To be calculated by adding the marks obtained in the best five subjects) or 50% marks in the Honours subjects or related subjects are eligible to apply for admission in the Honours Course.

b) Students carrying pass marks in at least five subjects are eligible to apply for admission in the General Course.

c) Admission will be done on Merit basis and the Merit point for admission in Honours Course is to be calculated by adding 10% of total marks obtained in the best five subjects at H.S or equivalent examination with the marks obtained in the subjects or a related subject in which the admission in Honours Course is sought.

d) For admission in general and Honours Course a student must have passed in two language subjects of which one must be English at H.S Examination.

e) If any student of science stream in Higher Secondary level applies for Honours Course in Bengali, his/her merit points is to be calculated proportionately by excluding the marks obtained in the practical examinations.
